Mid-America Carpenters Regional Council Arbitrations

MARBA received an arbitration demand in the month of August regarding an employer's alleged refusal to appoint a steward.

Laborers Joint Grievance Committee

The Laborers JGC did not meet in September. The next meeting will be on October 28, at the Laborers District Council office in Burr Ridge beginning at 9:00 a.m. At this point there are no grievances set to be heard. The Union will advise the JGC if there are any other grievances set to be heard about two weeks prior to the 28th.

Operating Engineers Joint Grievance Committee

The Operators JGC met on September 17, 2025, at the Union offices in Countryside. There were initially ten (10) grievances to be heard, however, by the time the JGC convened there were six (6) grievances that went forward. Of those six (6), three (3) were filed against the same company for the same issue (e.g. bounced payroll checks), two (2) were filed against the same company for the same issue (e.g. non-bargaining unit members running equipment). The single grievance alleged that a non-bargaining unit member was operating equipment.

As it relates to the bounced checks, the contractor in question did not appear at the hearing(s) and per the JGC rules the Committee was able to issue a decision based on the testimony and evidence presented by the Union. The JGC upheld the grievance and awarded the three members the initial amounts due under the check as well as penalties for the delay in getting them their checks. The other three remaining grievances that involved non-bargaining unit members operating equipment were also all upheld and the JGC awarded the Union the amounts being sought under the initial grievances. The next JGC meeting is scheduled to be held Wednesday, November 25, 2025, beginning at 8:30 a.m. at the Union offices in Countryside. The Union will advise how many cases are set to go forward. There are currently zero grievances on the docket.

Teamsters Joint Grievance Committee

The Teamsters JGC did not meet in September. The next meeting is scheduled for October 30, 2025, to be held at the MARBA offices beginning at 9 a.m., provided there are any grievances set to go forward. There are currently no grievances on the docket.

NLRB and Amazon Both Sue State of New York Over State Legislature's Passage of Labor Law

The National Labor Relations Board and Amazon have both filed suits regarding the New York legislature passing a law aimed at settling private industry labor issues/disputes. The law would allow the New York Public Employment Relations Board to recognize private industry bargaining representative petitions when the NRLB does not assert its jurisdiction over such matters. The NLRB suit alleges the legislation creates a parallel regulatory structure that undermines the federal labor policy Congress designed to be national in scope. Acting General Counsel of the NLRB, William Cowen, stated that "legislation like this cannot be reconciled with the Supremacy Clause of the U.S. Constitution." Amazon's suit is against the New York PERB, and it attempts to avoid having the state law applied to Amazon in a case currently pending at the federal level.

The New York legislature passed the law in response to the lack of quorum at the NLRB. As has been previously reported, the uncertainty in terms of Board Member Wilcox's seat and the recent expiration of Board Member Kaplan's seat has left the Board with just one remaining member, short of the three necessary for the Board to have a quorum. Additionally, the 5th Circuits recent decision in a Space X case calls into question the NLRBs ability to process ULPs in the 5th Circuit (likely setting up an argument in front of the Supreme Court). The New York law as currently constituted would supposedly allow the PERB to handle those cases as well in the event the NLRB decided not to assert jurisdiction over ULPs in New York.
