# Illinois Legislature Wraps Up Veto Session with Transit Funding Bill Passage

In the wee hours of the morning on Halloween, the Illinois Legislature passed a bill that would "rescue" the regional transit system consisting of Regional Transportation Authority, Pace, METRA, and the CTA. The bill, entitled Northern Illinois Transit Authority (NITA) Act, approved a \$1.5 billion dollar funding of the agencies. To make up the \$1.5 billion the Act will take approximately \$860 million dollars in motor fuel tax that would otherwise be disbursed to road agencies as well as approximately \$200 million dollars in interest generated on the motor fuel tax. To offset this transfer in motor fuel tax the legislature increased tolls on the Tollway \$0.45 beginning on January 1, 2027. Additionally, the bill authorized a 0.25% increase in sales tax across the RTA area which consists of the northern Illinois six county region: Cook, Lake, DuPage, Will, Kane, and McHenry counties. This additional sales tax increase should create an additional \$1 billion dollars a year over the next 10 years for road and bridge work. The bill also creates a new agency that would be a "stronger" version of the RTA allowing for a universal fare system and coordination of scheduling amongst the local transportation agencies. The bill passed both chambers of the legislature with the support of only Democratic lawmakers.

### **National Labor Relations Board Still Without Quorum**

The National Labor Relations Board has been in flux for several months. There is currently only one (1) Board member, David Prouty. Member Gwynne Wilcox has been out of office after being removed from her position by President Trump in January 2025. Wilcox is in the process of litigating removal. The Supreme Court has held her removal will be allowed to remain in effect while her case works its way through the system. Member Marvin Kaplan had his term expire at the end of August. Two additional seats have been vacant for quite some time. In order for the Board to have a quorum allowing it to conduct business three (3) members must be present. There are currently two (2) individuals that have been nominated by President Trump to fill two of the seats that are currently open, James Murphy and Scott Mayer.

The Senate Health, Education, Labor, & Pensions (HELP) Committee recently advanced Murphy's nomination to the full Seante for consideration by a vote of 12-11. Mayer also had a hearing in front of the HELP Committee at the same time as Murphy; however, Mayer's nomination was not

advanced to the Senate for consideration. Mayer's hearing in front of the HELP Committee had some contentious moments with some of the Republican members and the Committee decided not to advance his nomination. It is unclear if the Committee will hold a vote on whether to send his nomination to the full Senate for consideration. If the Committee does not move his nomination forward it is unclear who President Trump may consider in Mayer's place. The HELP Committee, in advancing Murphy's nomination, also advanced President Trumps nomination for NLRB General Counsel, Crystal Carey, to the full Senate. The NLRB General Counsel is currently being filled in an acting capacity by William Cowen. Cowen has served at the NRLB in a variety of roles for decades. It remains to be seen when votes on Murphy and Carey will take place. Should Murphy be confirmed by the Senate the Board will have two members, still one short of a quorum.

With all of that as a backdrop, the government shutdown has temporarily ceased NLRB operations, mainly those related to case handling (i.e. investigating unfair labor practices and conducting routine elections). The backlog of cases that need to be resolved is continuing to grow. It remains to be seen exactly when the NLRB will have a quorum so it can address the backlog of cases that are building up during the government shutdown and since the removal of Member Wilcox.
